Freed by God's Love

What is Lutheran?

Do you ever get asked this? Maybe you've asked it for yourself. A dental assistant asked me recently, as she confirmed my occupation. I had to answer fast before my mouth went completely numb, "We cut to the chase- it's all about love, the love of God given through Jesus."

Aside from all the caricatures that Garrison Keillor has sent up regarding what Lutheran is, it's primarily a way of understanding Jesus. Jesus comes to free us from whatever drags us down. Jesus is the good news, or gospel, that enlivens you, me and the whole world. Writer Anna Madsen says, "the gospel frees us to see death in all its forms, to then call a thing what it is, to renounce that which is not of God, to tend to those who mourn or suffer, and in Jesus' name, usher in comfort, hope, justice, and something new."

Faith doesn't begin with me or my good works, or my ability to please God. Instead, everything starts with God's desire to love me first. That's what Jesus came to teach, live and finally died and rose to accomplish. My part is to receive this great gift. To live with gusto, confidence, hope and joy- not in the future, but today!

It's a shattering reversal. Relationship with God is not transactional, like so many other relationships in this world around us. If you do this, then you deserve this. That is a transactional relationship. That's not how God wants it to be with us. In Jesus, God gives us everything first, without strings attached. That makes it a transformational relationship. What was dead is now alive! What was hopeless is now hope-filled! We are free, free to respond to God's deep, abiding love.

What is Lutheran? Let's cut to the chase. We've been freed by God's love. Where will God's love take you today?

November 5 – The Future of the Wakefield Property with Members of the Congregational Council and Social Ministry Team

Since 1994, our church has been the owner of the house at 4322 Wakefield Street, our next-door neighbor, a three-bedroom house with an attached garage. The house has been part of our ministry in different ways over the years, and most recently served as transitional housing as part of a partnership with The Road Home and the Madison Community Foundation. Our most recent sponsored family moved out of the house in February 2023, and since then we have been able to accomplish significant and necessary maintenance work on the property.

We now need to make decisions about how we might use the Wakefield House. At this week's Adult Forum, members of our Church Council will share: an assessment of the current condition of the house, a proposal for future use from the Immigration Action Team, additional possible options for the property. We hope this will be an interactive discussion where our church leaders can hear your thoughts about the various options and opportunities presented to us, as we try to discern the best possible path for our congregation.

November 12 – Revisiting the Marquette and Joliet Expedition of 1673: Lifting Up Long-Ignored Native Voices, with Michael Douglas

Once heralded as a great voyage of discovery, the mapping of a canoe route from Montreal to the Mississippi River had profound consequences for the indigenous cultures of the region. How we view this remarkable, albeit challenging

achievement today is altogether different from how it was viewed one hundred years ago, or even fifty years ago. This conversation will identify long ignored Native voices and seek to explore the ambitions of New France against a background of European disease, internecine warfare, and dispossession of Native lands. As a veteran re-enactor and devoted enthusiast of material culture, Michael Douglas will bring a collection of historic objects to help illustrate the talk and perhaps inspire conversation. Michael Douglas is an historian and was the site Director of the Wisconsin Historical Society's Villa Louis for 30 years. Michael spent 5 post-retirement summers working as a Park Ranger at Effigy Mounds National Monument. He has lived and worked in Prairie du Chien, on the banks of the Mississippi River, for 40 years.



November 19 - Honey Harvesting with Kurt Runzheimer

Midvale Member Kurt Runzheimer and his family have been keeping bees and harvesting honey in Dane County for more than 25 years. In an Adult

Forum in Spring of 2022, the Runzheimer family shared how they raise and care for the bees and some of the environmental challenges they face.

In this session, Kurt will talk about how honey is made, how it's influenced by the environment surrounding the beehives, and the process of collecting and sharing honey. Please join us to learn about the gifts of God's creation shared with us through the bees.

Did you know, I was 2 weeks old in my first family photo in the church directory. I wanted to share this just so you know that when I say Midvale Community Lutheran Church has been with me my entire life, I mean my. Entire. Life. all 17 years.

Growing up attending Sunday school, worship, being a part of the Christmas Programs and VBS, joining confirmation and being the one and only confirmation class confirmed in the church parking lot. I have always seen Midvale as a safe and calming place for me. When I was little, I was always scared to go down to the basement of my house alone, but at that same age I had no fear walking around the basement halls of the church alone in the dark because I always knew that nothing could get me there because it was God's house, still is.

be afraid to go anywhere because God is protecting me everywhere I go. In case anyone was wondering, I am not scared of my basement anymore.

I also have always known that I will never be judged here, this community is so welcoming, loving and fun. I can't think of one bad experience that I have had here. In fact that's the reason I felt so comfortable sharing this today.

Since my confirmation I have backpacked with the high school youth group in Montana, traveled to Denver with the group for our mission trip this past summer and have enjoyed being a leader for VBS and helping to teach Sunday school. I know that this is God at work through me, through my actions, to help this church, our community and the world around us.

Through Midvale and the people at Midvale, I have grown in my faith and connections with God. I now strive to be as caring as the shepherds in Sunday school. I strive to be as adventurous as the friends I have met at church. I strive to be a great leader like the great faith leaders I have looked up to since I was little. I strive to have childlike faith like the kids that come to learn about God every week. And I strive to show the love and kindness that has been shown to me at this church to everyone I meet.


Lutheran World Relief - How our church is making a difference in Ukraine, Türkiye and more

A note about the Building Fund: We are on the cusp of paying off our mortgage from the 2010 Sanctuary renewal, with about \$30,000 remaining. Extra gifts over and above what is needed for our daily ministry by the end of 2023 and additional donations designated for the Building Fund give us the possibility of retiring our debt in the near future. We are not asking for pledges for the Building Fund for 2024. However, continued giving to the Building Fund in 2024, if you have a desire to do so, will aid us in paying off our current mortgage. Any gifts made toward the Building Fund that are above what is needed to pay off our mortgage will be a down payment on our Ministry Wing project.
